What is the overall <u>deductible</u>?	In- <u>network</u> : Individual \$250 / Family \$500.	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from <u>providers</u> up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .
Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u>?	Yes. Certain office visits, <u>preventive care</u> and <u>urgent care</u> in- <u>network</u> .	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. For example, this <u>plan</u> covers certain <u>preventive services</u> without <u>cost sharing</u> and before you meet your <u>deductible</u> . What is the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> for this <u>plan</u>?	In- <u>network</u> : Individual \$6,000 / Family \$12,000.	The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this <u>plan</u> , they have to meet their own <u>out-of-pocket limits</u> until the overall family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> has been met.

- All medical and hospital services not specifically covered in, or which are limited or excluded by your **plan** documents
- Donor egg retrieval
- Experimental and investigational procedures, except for coverage for **medically necessary** routine patient care costs for members participating in a cancer clinical trial with respect to the treatment of cancer or other life-threatening disease or condition
- Home births
- Immunizations for travel or work except where **medically necessary** or indicated
