| Are there services covered before you meet your deductible? | No. | You will have to meet the <u>deductible</u> before the <u>plan</u> pays for any services. |
| Are there other deductibles for specific services? | No. | You don't have to meet <u>deductibles</u> for specific services. |
| What is the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> for this plan? | <u>In-network</u> : Employee \$6,750 / Family \$13,500 . | The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this <u>plan</u> , they have to meet their own <u>out-of-pocket limits</u> until the overall family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> has been met. |

| Do you need a <u>referral</u> to see a <u>specialist</u>? | Yes. Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes.

If you don't have **Minimum Essential Coverage** for a month, you'll have to make a payment when you file your tax return unless you qualify for an exemption from the requirement that you have health coverage for that month.

Does this plan Meet Minimum Value Standard? Yes.

If your **plan** doesn't meet the **Minimum Value Standards**, you may be eligible for a **premium tax credit** to help you pay for a **plan** through the **Marketplace**.

About these Coverage Examples:
